Monthly Musings

Old Movies

Can you think of something that made total sense when you were younger but only makes partial sense now, or maybe no sense at all?

That question has been on my mind lately, because my wife and I have started showing our daughter some of our favorite childhood movies. Most of the time it goes great. But every now and then we hit something in a movie that simply doesn't compute for her, and we find ourselves pausing the film to explain it.

Nowhere has this been more obvious than in *Homeward Bound*. If you don't know it, the plot is simple: a family has to leave their home in Montana for the city, and they have to leave their three pets behind at a friend's ranch. The animals get restless, sensing something is wrong, and set off to find their family. The plot really turns when the woman watching the pets has to leave for a cattle drive and asks a friend to check on them. In the chaos, the three pets escape to go looking for their kids. She leaves her friend a handwritten note, on a small stack of paper, explaining which animals she's watching and what they need. The top sheet, the one that actually named the three pets in question, blows away. All her friend reads is "I have the animals with me," so he isn't worried when he doesn't see them.

Watching this with our daughter, she asked why the woman didn't just text her friend the instructions. Then why the man didn't text back to ask what was going on when he couldn't find the pets. Then, later, why the family didn't just post on Facebook that their dogs were missing. Weren't the pets chipped?

My wife and I just looked at each other. She wasn't wrong about any of it. A movie I loved as a kid, one that made perfect sense to me, now runs into a wall of very reasonable questions from someone who has never lived in a world without a phone in every pocket.

It got me wondering if church works the same way sometimes. Are there things we do, things that made complete sense to the people who started doing them, that don't carry the same logic anymore? Practices that were built for a world that has since moved on, but that we've kept going out of habit, or love, or just because that's how it's always been?

I don't think the continuation is automatically a problem. Some things are worth keeping even when the original reason has faded, the same way I still love *Homeward Bound* even though half of its plot depends on nobody having a phone. But I think it's worth asking the question honestly instead of avoiding it. Not everything we do has to be logically airtight to matter. Sometimes we hold onto something because of what it connects us to, not because of what it accomplishes.

But I also think it's worth checking. Because the things that no longer make sense to the next generation aren't always harmless nostalgia. Sometimes they're the very things standing between us and the people we're trying to welcome in. Are there things we do as a church simply because they've always been done? And when we look honestly at those things, do we find meaning worth keeping, or do we find something we're just used to doing?

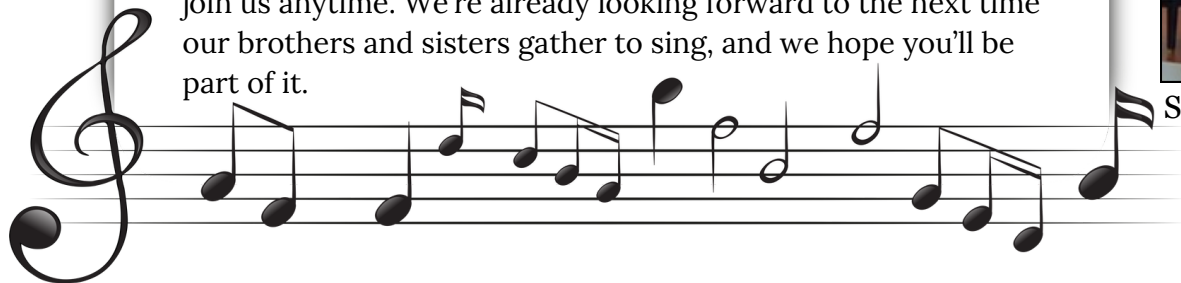


Brothers Choir Sunday

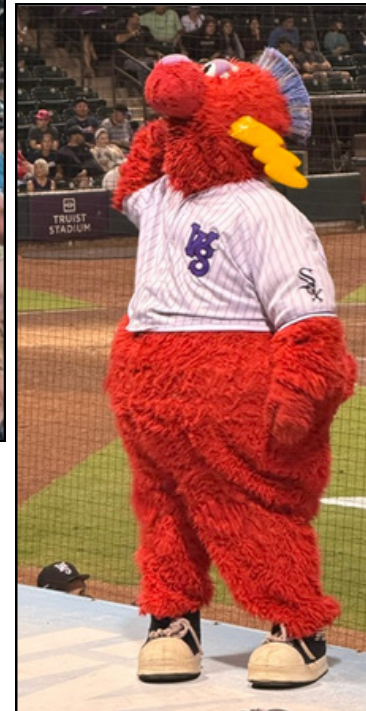

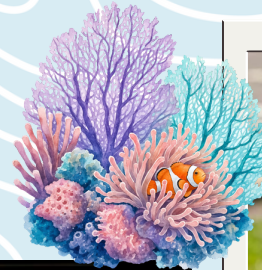
