Special Church Council
July 12, 2026

Purpose of meeting:

1. Update progress on plans for the new picnic shelter facility.
 - Our proposal was submitted to the FASC (Finance Advisory and Support Committee, Southern Province) and was approved. The committee made recommendations to amend our proposal with more detail on the budget and financing before presenting it to the PSSB (Provincial Support Services Board). Once approved by the PSSB, it will go to the Provincial Elders Conference (PEC) for final approval.
 - The Architectural Engineer has signed off and stamped the floor plans. Fee of \$1246.00, paid out of Capital Campaign.
 - T.J.Magarci has completed and delivered a stamped set of floor plans. He has been compensated \$6,000.00 for the completed plans from the Capital Campaign Funds.
 - Floor plans have been sent to the engineers for HVAC, Electrical, and Plumbing for respective drawings. Estimate the cost for completion of the plans:

Electrical and Plumbing drawings – \$4,000.00 HVAC drawings—\$2,000.00
To be paid out of capital campaign funds, as approved by the Church Council, in November 2025, to complete the drawing.

2. Present the following proposals to the congregation from the Joint Board.
(Motion needed for each step, followed by a majority vote by the Church Council)

- a. Demolish the existing Youth House
(approx. cost to demolish, fill, and pack site - \$15,000)
- b. After demolition expenses, transfer the remaining funds allocated to repair the youth house from the Capital Campaign fund to the New Picnic Shelter Facility Fund.
(Approx. \$25,000.00)
- c. Have the property surveyed if a previous survey is not available.
(Approx. \$1,500.00)
- d. Build the new facility on the site of the existing youth house.

3. Our next steps:
 - a. Complete plans as approved by the church council at our November 2025 meeting.
 - b. Submit plans to the City of King for approval
 - c. Obtain bids for construction.
 - d. Prepare an itemized budget and financial plan to present to Church Council and the PSSB.
 - e. Once approved by Council and the PSSB, submit final documents to the PEC for final approval.
