O joy, for all its former woes a thousand fold repaid!

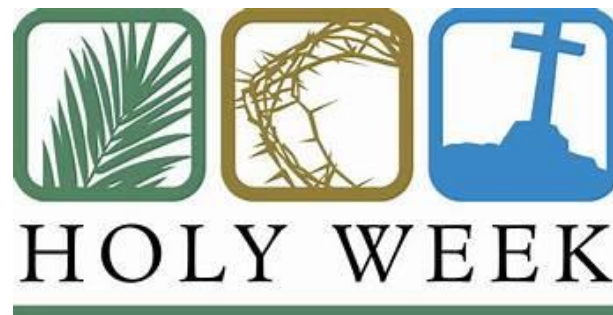
Bring near your great salvation, O Lamb for sinners slain;
