Chopping Onions and Doing Church

I was happy to receive an invitation to help with the Brunswick stew. I was happy to receive this for a few reasons. One, because one of the perks of my job is that doing stuff like that is work. I love when I get to spend time with folks in a somewhat informal setting. I get to hear what people are talking about when left to their own devices, I get to hear jokes, I get to tell a few, and I get to learn more about who people are. I love that.

The other reason I was excited to help with the Brunswick stew is because I love to chop onions. I do the majority of the cooking in our house, and onions tend to be a part of most meals. After 12 years of chopping onions, I have come to learn the best way to chop them is to cut them in half, in the direction of the top and bottom, then to cut vertical slits going almost to the end of the onion, and then cut horizontally across. If you want to get real fancy with it and have a really fine dice to your cut, you can slice it parallel with the cutting board, again almost to the end.

Now what is somewhat integral to this process is having the inside layers. Sometimes you cut into an onion and see that the inside looks a little off—maybe it's a little slimy or it's starting to sprout. Both are signs that the onion is about to turn, and then you have to remove that layer. If you do that, it's much harder to get a nice cut on the onion. Without those center layers, the outer layers don't have anything to rest on. The middle provides the support that the outer layers need. When that core is missing, what should be a clean, precise cut becomes messy and uneven because there's no foundation beneath it all.

This makes me think about church, in that doing and being church is like chopping an onion. If the center is gone, it's much harder to do. What is the true center of the church? Relationship is the true center of the church—relationship with Christ, and relationship with each other. If relationship is missing, there is nothing to support the rest of the institution. You can have all the programs, all the buildings, all the committees and traditions, but without that relational core, the outer structures have nothing to rest on. Just like an onion without its center layers, everything else lacks the support it needs.

That's why things like Mission Blitz, the Brunswick stew, and prep for the Women's Fellowship Candle Tea are so important—because they connect us to each other. They help develop or further facilitate relationships with each other and, in turn, with Christ. These aren't just "extra" activities or social events we tack onto the "real" work of church. They are the real work of church. They strengthen the core, the center layers that provide support for everything else.

As we continue to grow as a church, we need to continue to find ways to strengthen the core of our being—relationship with Christ and relationship with each other. Because when that center is strong and healthy, everything else we do as a church becomes easier, more meaningful, and more effective. When the core is solid, we can weather the difficult seasons, celebrate the joyful ones, and continue to grow together in faith.

Do you feel connected to the core of the church, or are you finding yourself on one of the outer layers? What would it take to move closer to that relational center? How can we, as a community, help each other stay connected to the core that supports us all?




