- free play



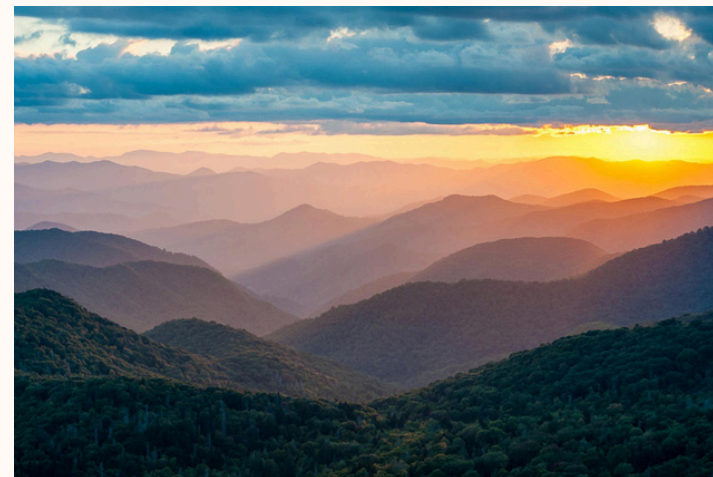
These activities help explore Bible stories while building friendships and learning about God's love in age-appropriate ways.
