Youth Mission Trip to the Dominican Republic

Happy New Year! I hope the year is starting off for you the way you want it to. Typically, a newsletter message at this point in the year talks about new beginnings and fresh starts. But today I want to talk about something that started a long time ago and is still shaping me—and how sometimes the most important moments happen when we help deepen someone else's journey of faith.

When I was in the ninth grade, I was in the youth program at New Philadelphia Moravian Church. We got to take a mission trip to Jamaica. We landed in Montego Bay and then took a three hour plus bus ride into the interior of the island, up into the mountain community called Patricktown. There was a Moravian church that was in some disrepair, and our group worked on it all week. During the day we worked at the church, and in the evening we stayed in the homes of people who lived in the town.

I think back on this trip and how much it impacted me. It was the first time I was the minority. The first time I saw real poverty. I had to learn to eat what I was served, to live in a completely different way, to be welcomed by strangers who only knew me as a fellow Moravian. That trip shaped so much of who I am. It was, in so many ways, the beginning of my faith journey.

Here's the thing though—I couldn't have gone on that trip without help. My family couldn't afford it on our own. People in my congregation stepped up and sponsored me. They gave \$25 here, \$100 there, some gave more. I didn't realize it at the time, but those people weren't just writing checks—they were investing in my life. They were participating in my formation as a disciple. They were co-laborers in shaping who I would become. They planted a seed.

This May, our youth will have that same opportunity. They'll travel to Mission Emanuel in the Dominican Republic (May 30–June 5), partnering with a 30-year ministry serving over 500 children through schools, medical clinics, water purification, and community development. They'll work alongside Dominican partners on construction projects, run VBS programs, support medical clinics, and build relationships. The total cost per youth is \$2,155, covering airfare, lodging, and meals for the six-day trip.

We're inviting you to become a co-laborer in this mission. Here's how your gift participates in their journey:

Co-Laborer – \$25 or \$50 contributes toward youth trip expenses

Co-Laborer – \$195 covers one full day of lodging and meals

Co-Laborer – \$575 covers half the lodging and meals for the entire trip

Co-Laborer – \$1,000 covers complete airfare to the Dominican Republic

Co-Laborer – \$2,155 covers the complete mission experience for one youth

Every gift—no matter the amount—makes you a participant in what God is doing in a young person's life. You become part of their story. You help create the moment when they realize God's work is bigger than they imagined. You invest in the experience that might set them on a path they'll still be walking 25 years from now.

The people who sponsored my trip to Jamaica didn't know how that experience would deepen my walk of faith. They couldn't have known how that seed they planted would grow. But they trusted that investing in a young person's faith journey mattered, even without knowing exactly where it would lead. They planted a seed and trusted God with the harvest.

As we start this new year, you have the opportunity to help deepen and expand the faith journeys already unfolding in our youth. When you give to this mission trip, you're not just sending kids to the Dominican Republic. You're investing in the next chapter of their journey. You're helping their faith grow deeper roots. You're becoming co-laborers in Christ's mission of transformation—for our youth, for the people of Nazaret and Cielo, and maybe even for yourself.


