Church Council

Sunday, November 13, 2022

The Church Council for King Moravian Church convened after church potluck meal in the Fellowship Hall. The Rev. Doug Rights called the meeting to order. He opened the meeting with prayer.

Board members assisted in counting church members present to determine that with over 70 members in attendance, we had a quorum.

The next item of business was to appoint a secretary to take minutes for the meeting. Terri Lyda was nominated. Mark Johnson made a motion to accept the nomination and Fran Newsome seconded the motion. The motion carried and Terri Lyda was appointed as recording secretary.

The minutes from the last Church Council were read. One correction was made to change goal date of capital campaign from 2022 to 2024. We also added names of elected Trustees to include: Paula Hall, Tim Huff, and Darrell Goins and our Provincial Synod Delegates were Paula Hall, Rachael Butts, and Ethan Smith. With these corrections and additions, Gina Handy made a motion to accept the minutes. It was seconded by Bill Pulliam. Motion carried and the minutes were accepted.

The nominating committee presented the slate of nominees for new board members. Elders retiring are Candice Covington, Gina Handy, and Doug Gordon. Trustees retiring include Budge Gage, Sue Donathan, and Doug Spainhour. They were all given a round of applause. Nominees for Elders were then presented. They are Homer Dearmin, Doug Gordon (Doug has served one term as Elder and is able to be reelected), and Don Lucas. Rev. Doug Rights opened the floor for nominations. No other nominations were made. A motion was made by Bill Pulliam and seconded by Ken Lyda to close the nominations and to accept the nominees by acclamation. The motion carried. Nominees for Trustees are Perry Bowman, Ed Sipes, and Cynthia Sevier. Rev. Doug Rights opened the floor for nominations. Seeing none, Kathy Rights made a motion to close nominations and accept the nominees by acclamation. Jennifer Burge Carter seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The Board and Staff Reports were next on the agenda. The Rev. Doug Rights reviewed the Pastor's Report. He also led the group in review of the Director of Christian Education's Report. Rachael was out of town due to the birth of her sister Hillary's new little boy. The Elders Report was presented and Desty McEwan, the Vice Chair of the committee was available for questions. The Trustees Report was presented by Doug Spainhour. He reviewed Trustee Highlights Report. He thanked the Finance Committee for all their hard work this year on the budget. Members of the Finance Committee included Kim Thomas, Desty McEwan, Budge Gage, and Doug Spainhour. He then presented the budget which had been available for review on line this past week. Copies were also available at the meeting for review. Doug Spainhour reviewed the financial overview narrative. He noted that the PEC has changed their formula for our Provincial Share for next year that results in 16% less for next year. He also did a review of our Outreach Ministry this year. Doug also gave an update on our Capital Campaign. He thanked the committee for all their hard work this year. The committee members are Rev. Doug Rights, Desty McEwan, Budge Gage, Dane Heath, and Paula Hall. They are working on a mailing that goes out in the next few weeks to help with pledges. Rev. Doug Rights thanked Doug Spainhour for his hard work this past year. He also thanked him for all his work on the Audio/Visual Committee this year. Rev. Doug Rights gave thanks from Drake Flynt to the congregation for the new piano and the newly built piano platform. Thanks go to Robert Simpson, Corky Newsome, Jerry Saunders, Kevin Newsome, and Neil Newsome for building this platform.

Rev. Doug Rights led the council in a remembrance of Saints departed since our last church council. Jim Anderson, Henry Bowman, Bill Byerly, Roger Cooke, Angus Hammond, Thelma Mathews, Daryl

Neve, Mac Powell, Doris Rutledge, and Eric Emery will all be remembered with love. We sang the hymn "Jesus Makes My Heart Rejoice". A motion was then made by Mark Johnson and seconded by Doug Spainhour to adjourn. The motion carried and the meeting closed.

Special Called Church Council Meeting

October 22, 2023

Our congregation held a special called Church Council meeting today following the worship service in the sanctuary. The Rev. Doug Rights reviewed the updated Rules and Regulations policy with the congregation. These changes needed to be presented to the congregation before voting for approval at our Annual Church Council on Sunday, November 12, 2023. He went through each updated change, explaining wording and changes. He then received questions from the congregation. There were questions concerning associate members, required assessments, church discipline, and new preschool statement concerning board responsibilities. Doug answered and discussed all questions. Cynthia Sevier also gave input from Trustees viewpoint. There do seem to be some concerns in the congregation on some of these topics.

PASTOR'S REPORT FOR 2023 CHURCH COUNCIL

It continues to be a blessing and a privilege to serve this church family. The people of King Moravian and the ministry of this congregation continue to make a wonderful difference in my life. Throughout this past year I have greatly appreciated the wonderful support I have received from our special and hard-working staff, from our committed board members, and from so many loving church members.

A major project for our church this past year has been our Capital Campaign. It has been wonderful to see how many of our members and friends of our church family have helped us raise through pledges, fundraisers, memorials, and honorariums over \$300,000 toward our goal of \$500,000. We are at a point where we can begin projects and pass on the ten percent of what we raise to King Outreach Ministry and our Mission Blitz.

Another large project this year was our goalsetting event. This year we invited all our members to attend house meetings where they could share about our church and what they would like to see happen. I appreciate everyone who took part in these events, to those who hosted them, to our board members who led them, and I appreciate all the responses shared. From this sharing, our Joint Board set our church goals this year.

I appreciate the work that has been done on our goals. Our various boards, committees, staff members, and individuals have helped us meet many of them. New groups have formed, studies shared, enhanced social media, stronger partnership with our ministry partners, and efforts toward better communication are some of the results from this year's goals.

A temporary, yet a very important group, is our 100th Anniversary Committee. For the past two years this committee has laid the groundwork for our church's 100th Anniversary. A special Sunday this year was our 99th Anniversary Sunday. Not only did we celebrate 99 years of the ministry of King Moravian, but we also kicked off our 100th year.

Earlier this year at our first Joint Board meeting of the year, I asked our board members what they would like to see at King Moravian Church year. My response was I felt with all the challenges we had the previous two years with COVID, that we were at a point when we were about to turn a corner and get back to the church we were before COVID with good attendance, strong programs, and momentum for even greater and better days ahead. In some ways I feel we have turned the corner with our services, programs, and a special spirit about us. Yet there are some areas where we have not quite turned the corner, particularly in people coming to church. Our attendance is good, yet it could be better. We miss those who are not with us. We miss those in our church family who are not with us on a regular basis. I believe we are better when we are together.

For me, there are many great things about King Moravian. I also see us as a church family that continues to have the potential for even greater blessings. As we move from this year's Church Council and on into our 100th year as a church family, it is my hope and prayer that we will be all we can for the Lord. That we will continue to live out our 100th Anniversary theme, "In All Things Love", and live it out in even greater ways. My hope and prayer is we will meet our Capital Campaign goal. My hope and prayer is all who can be with us will be here, to those with needs we will do what we can to meet them, and that we will always be open and inviting to all who need a church home. My hope and pray is King Moravian will be a bright and shining light in our community and a light to the Moravian Church of what a church is as we come together and serve and give and make a difference in the world.

Please know you have a pastor who looks forward to all these things to happen and who is here to serve you and the ministry of this church to help make it happen. Please know I am here for the Lord and here for you. Please let me know what you need from me, and know I love you and count it a privilege to serve you.

Preschool

I have continued to be part of the preschool committee and have attended all preschool meetings in support of Tina and the preschool teachers. I have assisted with preschool graduation, Lovefeast, and other events hosted by the preschool.

Sunday school

The junior Sunday school class is taught by Terri Lyda and Nancy Witt. They use Deep Blue curriculum. The middle and sr.high Sunday school is taught by Rachael Butts. They use various curricula about navigating the christian life and the bible.. There is a new Sunday school class that meets in the women's parlor. They use The Wired Word curriculum. The Good News class is led by Sue Gentry and Lynne Doby. They use the Present Word curriculum.

Children's Ministry

Vacation Bible school was July 12th-14th.. We used a Group's Weekend VBS -Where Jesus cares for you. During those days we studied how God forgives and has unconditional love for us.. Each night there was an opening session, bible story, snack, music, recreation, craft, and closing session. There were over fifty children registered.

Safe Sanctuary guidelines are still in place. We have twenty seven people that are Safe Sanctuary certified. There will be a renewal opportunity in the Spring.

Congregational Events

Served on the Share the Blessing committee and volunteered for Mission Blitz, October 13th- 15th.. We were able to complete 9 house projects as well as church maintenance projects. I was honored to give the devotion on Friday morning. I also helped coordinate breakfast,food deliveries, job sites, and organized volunteers.

Provincial

Completed certification for Christian Education and was approved by the Commission on Ministry in February of 2023

- Completed all required modules online through Opening Doors of Discipleship.
- Completed a book study with my assigned mentor.
- Met monthly with my assigned mentor.
- Completed a Moravian Polity course.
- Completed case scenarios.

Moravian Ministries Association:

I have served on the Moravian Ministries Association planning committee for 3 years. As a committee we conduct a monthly meeting with programming for educators, pastors, clergy, and retired church workers. I have signed on for another two years of programming and have committed to work with bishop Lane Sapp and Rev. Margaret Norris for training to be head chair in the fall of 2024.

Moravian Ministries Association retreat planning committee

Yearly retreat in September for educators, pastors, clergy, PEC, and retired church workers

I serve as a representative for the MMA retreat planning team. At this year's retreat we had over 70 members attend at Laurel Ridge. I was responsible for registration, promotion, and taught a workshop on self care.

I am on the 2024 retreat planning committee.

I serve on a sub committee of the Commission on Congregational Development where we approve the literature for current and future educators that are in the process of certification.

I meet monthly with fellow educators in the province and discuss with the Commission on Congregational Development.

ELDERS REPORT

1. Our first meeting was on Jan. 10. At that meeting we discussed the recent Lessons and Carols service and how we believed weather kept attendance lower than normal. We then discussed plans for the year to come. We talked about topics that ranged from creative ways of collecting money, such as bulletin QR codes to our goal of revisiting the Rules and Regulations of the church. Rachael discussed her progress on Women's Fellowship going forward. Doug also said he was beginning a new year of Pastor's Prayer Partners.
2. On Feb. 10, the Joint Board met to begin our annual board retreat, held at the Senior Center at KRA. We reminded everyone that Ash Wednesday service would be held on Feb. 22 for the imparting of ashes. On Feb. 11, our retreat took priority and goal setting was the main topic. There was lively discussion in the meeting, to say the least. There was a brief review of our rules and regulations at the time. We also announced that on Feb. 19, Rachael Butts would be certified as Director of Christian Education and be sworn in by PEC member, Rev. Christy Clore.
3. On Mar. 14, Elders met and discussed calendar issues going forward. We planned Graduate Sunday and a potluck luncheon for June 4, 2023. We then proceeded to delve further into the Rules & Regulations, making grammatical and politically correct changes as we read through it. Lenten services were discussed during the meeting as well.
4. On Apr. 11, our concentration was on the review of Lenten services, Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter services. A special thanks to the readers during Holy Week and the extraordinary work by Drake Flynt and Jennifer Dunn. The number of viewers during Holy Week ranged from 22 to 112. Suggestions were made to order new Holy Week books and possibly move the services from 7:00 to 6:30. The crosswalk was also held, per usual, on Good Friday. We also brought up the possibility of moving Love Feast to Palm Sunday morning, unless there is a confirmation class that day. Also discussed at the April meeting was the length of services and trying to keep them within the one-hour time frame. Also in April, we recommended an outdoor worship device on the 23rd with youth participation along with a bake sale with lemonade. Finally, we discussed the church yard sale on 4/28-4/29. King Moravian also planned to participate on Meet Me on Main on 4/29 and hand out Moravian sugar cake.
5. At the May 9 meeting we had a discussion about the sound at the outdoor services and discussed ways to improve it. New bulletin formats, due to the work of Paula Jennings, Rachael and Leigha, along with other methods of collection were reviewed and approved. We also changed the potluck lunch to honor our graduates to June 11 instead of the 4th after church, due to scheduling conflicts. Our continued review of the Rules and Regs were put on line so we could review more at home and recommend changes as we found them.
6. Basically, this meeting was over R&R, with revisions and an updated document.
7. There was no meeting in July. The Executive Director of the Moravian Music Foundation, Dr. Bruce Earnest, led the July 30th service.
8. On Aug. 8, R&R was discussed further and we decided to consult the Book of Order and the PEC for answers to questions we had. We also talked at length about retention and possibly contacting members we haven't seen in a while.
9. Sept 12 we reviewed upcoming special services: World Communion Sunday Oct. 1; Anniversary Sunday with Lovefeast and potluck Oct. 8; All Saints Sunday Nov. 5.; Festival of the Moravian Church, Nov. 12, followed by potluck and Church Council. Elders departing were asked for recommendations for nominees.
10. On October 10, Jerry Saunders agreed to the call to serve as Congregational Acolyte. He was approved and will be installed on Nov. 5 by Bishop Lane Sapp. Discussion included somehow inserting world events, especially tragedies before or following worship. The suggestion of a prayer concern box be placed in the vestibule. Going forward, as previously mentioned, the Festival of the Moravian Church will be Nov. 12 with Communion; Thanksgiving Sunday with Lovefeast is Nov. 19; Christ the King Sunday will be Nov. 26; youth Sunday will be the first Sunday of Advent, Dec. 3; Lessons and Carols will be Advent 2, or Dec. 10 at 11:00 am and 4:00 pm; Dec. 17 will be third

Sunday of Advent; and fourth Sunday of Advent will be Christmas Eve which includes the following: Children's Lovefeast and Candle service at 11:00 am; traditional Lovefeast and Candle services at 4:30 and 7:00 pm; Sunday, 12/31 will be Christmas Sunday.

11. A special meeting of the Joint Board will be Tuesday, Nov. 7. This will be included separately.

The Board of Trustees worked with the Graveyard Committee and staff to update the purchasing and documentation of plots at God's Acre. The graveyard was surveyed, and Graveyard Policies were updated. The roof to the building at God's Acre that is shared with First Baptist Church was replaced in the spring and approval was given to allow sublease of space at building.

Church facility updates included repair of leaky roof, updating exit sign lighting, repairing some tiles in the upstairs bathrooms, front door threshold repair, landscaping and water drainage problem resolved in yard at back of church building, dishwasher repaired, security locks installed for all Preschool classrooms, and trees trimmed at playground. The Trustees met with members of Building and Grounds and the Capital Campaign Committee to prioritize facility needs and repairs and map a plan to secure bids. Bids are being received for HVAC projects.

An additional college scholarship, the Jones Family Scholarship, was awarded this year and the Trustees drafted a document detailing all the church scholarships and communicated the information with the congregation.

Some updates were made to church financial policies. The Trustees worked with the Finance Committee in setting up the Zelle app so that online payments could be made for one-time events, i.e. youth events, as well as a new QR code for regular giving and tithing. The group also discussed different savings avenues for our Capital Campaign investments and moved money to a Money Market account managed through the Moravian Ministries Foundation in America (MMFA) because of the best interest rate. A link to MMFA was added to the church website to direct those interested to a link for Estate Planning.

The Trustees worked to better define the role and responsibilities of the maintenance and cleaning staff and worked with the Finance Committee to improve the Preschool budget process. J5 Cleaning Solutions LLC has been approved to provide cleaning services for all church buildings.
