KING MORAVIAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

Sunday, November 10, 2024

Opening of Meeting

At 1:15pm, November 10, 2024, the King Moravian Church Council Meeting for 2024 was called to order by Pastor Doug Rights in the fellowship hall.

The first order of business was to determine a quorum. Pastor Doug and board members made the determination that a quorum was met. The count included an excess of 60 members present.

The next order of business was to appoint a secretary to record the minutes. Terri Lyda is not well and Janie Young was not available so Barbara Sudol was asked by Pastor Doug. Mark Johnson made a motion to close the nominations for council secretary which was seconded by Fran Newsom. The motion carried.

The 2024 minutes were read by Pastor Doug. There was one correction to correct the spelling of Janie Young's last name from "Youth" to "Young". Dottie Jones made a motion to accept the minutes as written, Desty McEwan seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Board Nominating Committee

Pastor Doug gave a report from the nominating committee. Mark Johnson and Terri Lyda are retiring from the Board of Elders. Barbara Sudol has agreed to serve another term. Those retiring from the Board of Trustees include Kathy Anderson, Paula Hall and Darrell Goins. The two youth representatives, Tate Shore and Zeb Mathis will remain; however, Zeb will move to the Board of Elders and Tate will move to the Board of Trustees. Pastor Doug then recognized the outgoing board members. Nominees for the Board of Elders 2025 were presented. They included C.W. Hill, Ty Marshall and Barbara Sudol. Pastor Doug asked for prayerful consideration for an additional board member. Bill Pulliam made a motion to close the nominations and accept the nominees by acclamation. Homer Dearmin seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Nominees for the Board of Trustees were presented. They included Kim Grabs, Desty McEwan and Michelle Newsome. The floor was opened for additional nominations. There were none. Mark Johnson made a motion to close the nominations and accept the nominees by acclamation. Doug Gordon seconded the motion, and the motion carried. Youth Representatives nominated included Zeb Mathis and Tate Shore. The floor was opened for additional nominees. There were none. Kathy Rights made a motion to close the nominations and accept the nominees by acclamation. Holly seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Individual Board Reports

Mark Johnson reviewed the Board of Elders report as printed in the packet available to the congregation noting the Bible Study classes and Congregational events. We received several new members this year. We received a request from Debbie, Erin and Jonathan Allgood to be removed from the church membership roster.

Cynthia Sevier gave the Trustees report. She added that there were expenses that occurred this year i.e. pest control and increased utilities. Tithes and offerings are up while also meeting our Capital Campaign goal. Our investments have performed well this year.

The budget in the packet is not 100% correct as we are not aware of the new pastor's expenses. Our Provincial Share increased this year as well and is not reflected in the packet of information. Cynthia expressed appreciation to Jennifer Burge Carter and Budge Gage for counting our contributions each week, Lee Christensen for organizing and putting together all the Church Council meeting material, Kim Thomas, Chairperson and Finance committee, Building and Grounds committee. Dottie Jones questioned the status of the on-line giving portal and how far behind we are on the church operating budget this year. The status of the on-line giving portal is being researched and an update will be given on the progress later when more information is gathered by Kim Thomas and Cynthia Seiver. Cynthia Seiver stated that we have received some special gifts from the portal. Pastor Doug Rights and Cynthia stated that we currently have a budget deficit of over \$25,000.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Doug then proceeded with the Pastor's report. He expressed the joy he feels while serving King Moravian Church and so pleased to be a part of the 100th year celebrations. He stated we have a great staff and congregation. Another highlight is the successful Capital Campaign. Doug thanked the Boards for all the work and extra meetings in the call process as he will be retiring at the end of the year. Pastor Doug mentioned it's been a privilege to be a part of the 1st 100 years and looks forward to what may occur in the next 100 years.

Rachael Butts, DCE gave her report. She thanked Pastor Doug for all his contributions to King Moravian Church and stated she is really going to miss him. Attendance fluctuates for youth group meetings participation. Rachel planned her first mission trip to Nashville, TN this year. She is now head of Moravian Ministry Association. They are meeting monthly and work with retired clergy and educators along with Lane Sapp & Margaret Norris.

Tina Pratt, Preschool Director gave her report stating that 37 children graduated last year and on track for the same amount this year. The Preschool has had two successful year-end programs in the sanctuary this year and plan to do the same next year. Five Summer Fun sessions occurred in 2024. 88 families and 106 children are enrolled this year. The staff discussed moving the Halloween carnival to earlier in the month and possibly titling it fall carnival. Many other churches are now also having carnivals without a charge. The preschool will begin a fundraiser in a couple weeks selling treats from DEWEY'S Bakery. Bingo is scheduled for February 8, 2025 at First Christian Church. The music program from the Moravian Music Foundation is still a part of the curriculum and is no cost to the Preschool. Sue Gentry continues to come twice a month to read with the children. Pastor Doug will have chapel one more time before his departure. A Program titled Letter Land was purchased last year for the 4-5 age group and has been so successful that local educators are complementing the children's readiness for school. The Preschool has invested more modules into the program. Tina acknowledged the Men's Fellowship, Robert Simpson and Kevin Newsome for the work done recently on the Preschool playground and having the air

conditioning repaired. Tina expressed her appreciation to Pastor Doug for all his help/support. Ann Lawrence thanked Tina for posting pictures of Preschool events on Facebook.

Capital Campaign

Dane Heath reported that we have collected \$507,971 with approximately \$10,000 in pledges not yet collected. Approximately \$255,000 has been spent on HVAC repair; \$275,000 was budgeted for the repair. \$60,000 has been set aside for future roof repairs. The Trustees have been discussing next steps for the Youth House and \$15,000 has been set aside for future repairs. The Picnic Shelter is being reviewed for upgrade possibilities. After December 31, 2024 the committee is considering changing the focus of the group to Long Range Planning Committee. Anyone interested in participating on the committee should contact Dane. Dane expressed thanks to everyone that worked on the committee and stated how proud he is of what this church leaders and members are capable of.

Pastor Doug stated we have a lot to be thankful for and opened the floor for any further questions or comments.

Adjournment

Pastor Doug led the council in remembrance of the Saint; Martha Hall, departed since our last meeting. We then sang the hymn Jesus Make My Heart Rejoice.

Homer Dearmin made a motion to adjourn. Steve Kincaid seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT FOR 2025 CHURCH COUNCIL

The first pastoral report in a new church is always an interesting endeavor just because a minister jumps in and gets going, not necessarily having time just to scope out the lay of the land. It has been like jumping into a whirlwind for me. My previous church was smaller, not as much going on, and the scope of the church's work took less time to understand. Here, on the other hand, after being here for ten months, I feel like I still have so much to learn, including names. And while I do have a fair amount still to learn, I do feel like I have seen at least a comprehensive glimpse of who the church is. Here are some of the things that stand out as special about this congregation:

- A focus on and commitment to community.
 - Community is what people are missing in their lives and spiritual lives today.
- Different avenues for community.
 - There are several different ways for folks to become involved in community here, and there is a desire to find new ways for people to connect and find community.
- Appreciation for worship.
 - This church does worship well, both in what is offered in worship, and how the people participate in worship.
- There is an enjoyment of serving.
 - Members in this congregation know the joy of Christian service.
- There is a commitment to the future of the church.
 - There is a lot of energy that is looking forward both in the physical building of the church as well as the programming and spiritual offerings of the church.

I have been blessed to experience all of those firsthand. Those alone are powerful enough to keep a church active and thriving. Also, from my own experience, while those things can be taught, they are best when they are simply part of the essence of the organization. That seems to be the case here. While those attributes might be innate, they have to be continuously cultivated. This leads me into the second section I want to mention, which is areas that need facilitation.

- Continue to focus on what is already being done at a high level.
 - (Areas that continue to need focus are noted above.)
- Don't be bound just by tradition.
 - Tradition can be special and at the same time simply hold something in place, so we as a church need to pay attention to what resonates with us, and if it doesn't, we need to find something that does.
- Pay attention to personal energy.
 - We have a lot going on, and it is easy to get wrapped up in the church's work, so much so that the church can feel like a job. We have some members who know what this burden feels like, and we have others who think that sounds odd. If a person feels the burden, it is time to take a break and reconnect to the church through fellowship and restful activities. If a person feels like they don't have much connection to church except through worship and fellowship, it is time to step into more service-oriented roles.

Ten months in, I'm still learning, discovering, and grateful to be here. This church has strengths that many congregations spend years trying to build, and it's clear those strengths didn't appear overnight—they're the result of faithful work over time. The work ahead of us is to keep doing what we've been doing well while staying flexible enough to adapt when needed. That balance—honoring our strengths without becoming rigid, staying active without burning out—is where I believe we'll continue to find our path forward. Thank you for your patience as I continue to find my footing, and thank you for the work you've done and continue to do to make this community what it is. I'm grateful to be walking this path alongside you.

As we began our 101st year, our church family experienced both reflection and renewal. We said a heartfelt goodbye to Pastor Doug, and after a month of guest speakers in January, we joyfully welcomed Rev. Zach Deese and his family on February 2nd. Their arrival marked a new season of energy and vision for our congregation.

This year, we continued inviting members to share their gifts and passions through our Time and Talent sheets, helping us match willing hands and hearts with areas of service throughout the church. One joyful challenge we faced was our growing number of children in the nursery and Bible Time. To support this blessing, we hired additional childcare workers, ensuring that all children were nurtured in a safe and faith-filled environment.

Our outreach through the Blessing Box remained strong, providing a steady source of hope and sustenance for those in need. Within our worship planning, we placed renewed focus on connecting the children's message directly to the scripture and sermon each week, reinforcing a shared spiritual theme for all ages. Church facility updates included new HVAC system for old sanctuary. The old knob wiring and lighting have been replaced in old sanctuary as well. A new electrical panel was placed in old buildings to accommodate updates. Those projects were funded through Capital Campaign funds. The fellowship hall floors were buffed and preschool classrooms floors stripped and waxed. Oversight was given for pest management, mowing, landscape, cleaning, and copier contracts. Approval was given for the use of the parking lot for the farmers market during summer months. The building use form was updated because of the multiple requests for use of our facilities. A new building and grounds committee was formed. Many thanks to Robert Simpson for the years of service taking care of our buildings.

Oversight was given for the current 2025 budget and for the investments at the Moravian Ministries Foundation of America (MMFA). Chris Spaugh, President of MMFA met with us to give an update on our investments.

Note of thanks to Jim Hall and Budge Gage for counting contributions each Sunday, the Finance Committee for providing oversight and development of the budget, Kim Thomas for auditing financial records and processes, Lee Christensen, treasurer, for keeping financial records and payments accurate and up-to-date, Chris and April Bullin for major cleaning of all buildings and Building and Grounds Committee for keeping buildings and grounds in good shape.

King Moravian Narrative Budget for 2026

A description of the ministry and outreach of King Moravian Church for the year 2025 and our proposed expenditures:

- A. Worship-the heart of our church experience. Much of that is regular Sunday worship but also includes special seasonal services including Christmas, Lent, Holy Week, Easter and other special services. We propose to spend **\$145,366**
- B. Pastoral Care and Care of Individuals-the personal care that we receive through our church family especially during times of sickness, crisis, bereavement, troubled relationships, aging, and loneliness. We plan to spend **\$44,510**.
- C. Christian Education and Nurturing of People in their Faith-Nurturing people in their faith helps develop a trusting relationship with God. Our church utilizes the skills of our staff to plan and facilitate a Christian Education/Nurture Program. We plan to spend for personnel, resources, and facilities in the ministry **\$117,903**
- D. Benevolent Giving and Outreach Ministry-Our church's outreach can be divided into five categories:
 - Foreign and homeland missions, crisis ministry, education, etc. that we do together with other Moravian churches
 - Local benevolences
 - Outreach to volunteer services
 - Reaching out to bring people to our community of faith. A significant portion of staff time and use of facilities are to realize this ministry.

Propose to spend for benevolent giving and outreach ministry **\$103,317**

- E. Fellowship-Christian fellowship is eating, working, working for others, praying, worshiping, studying, laughing and sharing our lives with each other. In so doing, we share love, support, faith, hope and become a vital witnessing community. This will be **\$74,674** of our budget.

Total proposed budget: **\$485,769**
