
AN INCREDIBLE STORY ABOUT A GREAT THANKSGIVING HYMN

There are hymns that have very interesting and incredible stories behind them. Some of you might be familiar with the story behind "Amazing Grace" which was written by John Newton, a former slave trader, yet who after becoming a Christian wrote the words, "Amazing grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me." Some of you might be familiar with the story behind "It Is Well with My Soul" which was written by Horatio Spafford who, while traveling across the ocean close to where his four daughters tragically drowned, he wrote "When sorrows like sea billows roll; whatever the cost, Thou hast taught me to say it is well, it is well with my soul."

As we come to November which includes our celebration of Thanksgiving, I'm reminded of one of our Thanksgiving hymns that has an incredible story behind it. Martin Rinkart lived in the early 1600's. He was a pastor and an accomplished musician. He lived in Europe during the Thirty Years' War in the town of Eilenburg in Germany. Eilenburg was a walled city that became a place of refuge for thousands of displaced Germans. There he and those he was with face food shortages and the outbreak of a plague that caused many deaths. Other pastors in that town fled leaving Rinkart the only minister there. During the plague, he buried up to fifty people a day and one of those was his wife. During those years he never stopped ministering to the people. Yet despite all he endured during the years of the war and plague, a year after the war ended he wrote the following words:

Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices, Who wondrous things has done, in whom this world rejoices; Who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today.

O may this bounteous God through all our life be near us, With ever joyful hearts and blessed peace to cheer us; And keep us still in grace, and guide us when perplexed; And free us from all ills, in this world and the next.

In 1 Thessalonians 5:18, Paul says to "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." I believe this verse was lived out in Martin Rinkard's life. May his life be an inspiration to us no matter what we face in life knowing that God is always with us which always gives us reason to give thanks.

I hope everyone has a wonderful month and a very happy Thanksgiving! Please know how thankful I am to be part of this church family!


