**KING MORAVIAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING**  
**Sunday November 12, 2023**

At 1:15 pm the King Moravian Church Council Meeting for 2023 was called to order by Pastor Doug Rights in the Fellowship Hall following a potluck luncheon. Pastor Doug thanked all for the meal and proceeded with a word of prayer.

The first order of business was to determine a quorum. Pastor Doug and board members made the determination that a quorum was met following a count made during the meal. The count included an excess of 60 members present.

The next order of business was to appoint a secretary to record the minutes. Janie Young was nominated by Dane Heath. Mark Johnson made a motion to close the nominations which was seconded by Doug Gordon. The motion carried.

The 2022 minutes were read by Pastor Doug. There were no corrections. Bill Pulliam made a motion to accept the minutes as written, C.W. Hill seconded and the motion carried.

Desty McEwan gave a report from the Nominating Committee. Paula Jennings, Desty McEwan and Cathy Saunders are all retiring from the Board of Elders. Those retiring from the Board of Trustees include Jerry Saunders, C.W. Hill and Janie Young. The two youth representatives retiring include Olivia Harper and Gordon Grabs. Pastor Doug then recognized the outgoing board members followed by a round of applause. Nominees for the Board of Elders 2024 were presented. They included Holly Mathis and Meredith Smith. Pastor Doug asked for prayerful consideration for an additional board member. Dottie Jones made a motion to close the nominations and accept the nominees by acclamation. Holly Mathis seconded and the motion carried. Nominees for the Board of Trustees were presented. They included Chris Bullin, Dwayne Pratt and Bob Sullivan. The floor was opened for additional nominations. There were none. Bill Pulliam made a motion to close the nominations and accept the nominees by acclamation. Homer Dearmin seconded and the motion carried. Youth Representatives nominated included Zeb Mathis and Tate Shore. The floor was opened for additional nominees. There were none. Kathy Rights made a motion to close the nominations and accept the nominees by acclamation. Holly Mathis seconded and the motion carried.

The individual board reports were next on the agenda. Mark Johnson reviewed the Board of Elders report as printed in the packet available to the congregation. Cynthia Sevier gave the Trustees report as printed in the packet. She added thanks to Robert Simpson and Kevin Newsome from the Building and Grounds Committee for their ongoing efforts to maintain our four buildings. Cynthia noted there was an additional scholarship available this year from the Jones family. Cynthia thanked Dottie Jones and her family for their contributions. Cynthia referenced the narrative budget copies that were available for the congregation. She noted the totals listed for Worship and Christian Education and the importance of these two line items. Also, she noted that part of the budget increase was a result of our Provincial assessment and cost of living salary increases for our staff. Cynthia thanked the Finance Committee which includes Budge Gage, Kim Thomas, Desty McEwan, Paula Hall and Lee Christensen for their efforts and tireless work to keep our finances in order. Cynthia recognized Jennifer Burge Carter and Budge Gage for their efforts in counting each Sunday. Pastor Doug gave

thanks to Brent Seckman for his wonderful job cleaning and maintaining our church properties for the past three years prior to pursuing other interests.

Pastor Doug then proceeded with the Pastor's Report. He expressed the joy he feels while serving King Moravian Church. He stated we have a great staff and congregation. Highlights this year included goal setting, house meetings, and the 100th anniversary committee. He is pleased with our level of activity since Covid. He also thanked the congregation for all of our ongoing stewardship.

Rachael Butts DCE gave her report. She thanked Pastor Doug for all his contributions to King Moravian Church. Rachael stated her biggest accomplishment was obtaining her certification this year. She worked with Paula Jennings and Leigha Davis on the bulletin format, Facebook and Instagram. She also serves on the 100th Anniversary Committee. Lynne Doby posed a question as to the number of Sunday School classes available. Rachael stated there are 2 adult and 2 youth classes available. All are welcomed to each.

Pastor Doug presented a non-agenda item asking Dane Heath to give an update on the Capital Campaign. Dane stated that giving and pledges now total \$310,000.00. Robert Simpson, John Mathis, and Dane met with the Joint Board and gave a final presentation on construction and HVAC in the old sanctuary. They now will continue with work on planning phases 2, 3, and 4.

Robert Simpson reminded the congregation of the Preschool yearly drawing of raffle tickets which are currently available.

Pastor Doug then discussed the proposed changes to the KMC Rules and Regulations contained in the copies available to the congregation. He clarified the associate member's burial terms, the associate member's assessment fee (now \$0.00), and congregational discipline. Mark Johnson then read a statement from the Board of Elders: Church discipline in the Moravian Church is a tool for spiritual growth, not punishment. It's about guidance, correction, and aligning our lives with Christ's teaching. The process, driven by love and unity, involves teaching, counseling, and sometimes rebuking. When we deviate from the path, it serves as a reminder of Christ's teachings guiding us back. The church's governing bodies, the synod provides us guidance and supervision, while accountability among members encourages mutual spiritual growth. In essence, church discipline aids in our spiritual journey fostering faith, holiness, and a deeper relationship with Christ. Mark stated that the word discipline has a negative connotation and that KMC Elders see the response as a tool for spiritual growth.

Cynthia Sevier added that the PEC previously looked at the number of members and associate members when setting the yearly assessment. This is no longer a factor as their formula has changed. Susan Smith requested that we state that associate members never have to pay an assessment. Pastor Doug explained that this may be at some point beyond congregational control. We are following the Book of Order of the Moravian Church and Synod recommendations. Dottie Jones was concerned that the discipline stated was not in the spirit of Christ. Pastor Doug stated that it is intended to help, love and work through whatever issues may arise. He also explained that discipline is an individual process. Sue Gentry stated that at some point we may need to clarify at a provincial level. Desty McEwan spoke to the church's relationship with the Preschool. She stated the Preschool is part of our ministry at KMC and we have a fiduciary responsibility financially with the

preschool. The council attendees then applauded the Preschool. Desty made a motion to accept the Rules and Regulations as written, Dottie seconded and the motion carried.

Carolyn Byerly spoke with regard to her appreciation of the Mission Blitz team for building her ramp and the independence it has provided her.

Pastor Doug led the council in Remembrance of the Saints departed since our last meeting including Reba Elliott, John Elolf, Carson Funk, Tim Huff, Joanne Long and Mitzi Thomas. We then sang the hymn "Jesus Make My Heart Rejoice."

Budge Gage made a motion to adjourn. Doug Gordon seconded and the motion carried.

For the past year since our last Church Council in 2023, it continues to be a blessing and a privilege to serve as the pastor of King Moravian. King Moravian is a wonderful church, and I appreciate the many people in our church family who are involved and who help make King Moravian a great church.

I experienced many highlights this past year. The Advent and Christmas seasons are always special at King Moravian, and this past year it was great seeing us get back to good turnouts for our Lessons and Carols and Christmas Eve Lovefeast and Candle Services. From a teaching standpoint, highlights included leading our Lenten and Fall Studies and teaching the Confirmation Class. It is always a joy to work with our youth, and a youth highlight for me was the Mission Trip some of our youth and adults took to Nashville, Tennessee. It is also a great joy to be a small part of the Preschool program, and monthly Preschool Chapels are always special times to be with the children in our community and some from our church family.

Yet there are two highlights that made this past year a very special year for me as well as for many in our church family. One was our church's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Much thought and planning went into celebrating our 100<sup>th</sup> year. It was wonderful working with our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee. The other special highlight for me was our church family reaching our Capital Campaign goal. Besides a great service on Sunday, October 6, there was also the great announcement that our church family had reached its goal of \$500,000 which was raised in two years. For me, it was wonderful working with our Capital Campaign Steering Committee, seeing the generosity of many people in our church family, seeing people help with fundraisers for the campaign, remembering the hundreds of quarters our children brought for the Quarters for Kids board and how we continued to use the board to show our progress in the campaign, and seeing the amount of money received increase until we reached our goal. It was also great to see some of the campaign projects completed along with having plans for the rest of the projects. It was wonderful presenting a check to King Outreach Ministry at our anniversary service and acknowledging funds for our church's Mission Blitz which was a tenth of what we raised.

One thing that has been different this year was my announcement at our Joint Board Retreat in January and the Sunday following the retreat that I plan to retire at the end of this year. I appreciated our Provincial Elders Conference allowing us to go ahead and begin the call process for a new pastor. I have appreciated our Joint Board for their work in this process and I appreciated those who attended the events to provide helpful information for this process.

This past year we had two sayings which I believe made it a great year for our church family. One is our watchword for this year which has been Mathew 5:16 where Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." The other saying is our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary theme, "In All Things Love," which was also our Capital Campaign theme. ### **Preschool**

### **Sunday school**

They use various curricula about navigating the christian life and the bible. The Wired Word class meets in the Women's Parlor. The Good News class is led by Sue Gentry, Don Elliot, Dan Anderson, Marion Smith, Bonnie Crouch, and Lynne Doby. They use the Present Word curriculum.

### **Children's Ministry**

Vacation Bible school was July 17th -19th. We used Cokebury's VBS -Camp Firelight. During those days we studied Psalm 56:3 Whenever I am afraid I will put my trust in you. Each night there was an opening session, bible story, snack, music, recreation, craft, and closing session. There were 32 children registered.

We planned to begin our annual confirmation class in January. Women's Fellowship will meet on Jan.30. A Potluck lunch was planned for Feb. 4 and the Youth will have Bingo after worship on Feb. 11. The group voted to approve associate memberships for Michael and Linda Tuttle. We approved a vacation for Pastor Doug and Rev. Craig Atwood would speak on Feb. 11. Additional speakers were talked about for future vacancies and vacations for summer dates. The committee approved a Youth Mission Trip for 6/30 through 7/5. The group also discussed and approved sending cards to those infirmed or in need at future meetings.
2. There has been no entries thus far in the new Prayer Concerns box in the narthex. Confirmation Class for 2024 was announced. They included Flynn Southern, Kate Southern, Mallory's Wall and Harrison Wright. They were to meet with their mentors the following Sunday. Easter Sunrise service was discussed and the time was set. Barbara Sudol and Dwayne Pratt are taking care of the Communion trays and the Confirmation Class was helping with set-up and clean-up for said Communion. Barbara also spoke of the need for additional white stoles. Church goals were discussed along with a future Bible study. Our spring picnic was planned for May 5. A fall picnic was planned for September. We discussed a Junior Youth Communion Class for 1st - 5th graders which would include lunch. A membership request for Cooper Smith along with the Baptism of his and Rachel's daughters, Frances and Mary were approved.
3. Dwayne was to work on Communion trays and Barbara was granted permission to purchase more stoles for Communion. The Holy Week schedule was discussed and approved, which included Confirmation and Lovefeast on Palm Sunday. Sheila Patterson would be helping with flowers for the graves. Goals were again rehashed. Wednesday night cookouts were planned for April 3 and May 1. On April 14, we have Preschool Sunday. On the Saturday before, the Preschool Art in the Park will be held. Outdoor service was planned for May 5 followed by Potluck lunch. Sister and Brother Sundays were discussed, times TBA. A group from Confirmation Class requested and was approved for memberships. They were Hannah Duncan, Katharine Grabs, Emily Hepler, Flynn Southern, Mallorie Wall and Harrison Wright. Also requesting memberships were Robert Jones, Joy Jones, Jeff Jones, Jennifer Jones and Lynn Brannon. There were likewise approved by the Elders. The group thanked First Christian Church for allowing our Bingo night without charge. It was very successful.
4. Doug expressed his approval with Lenten studies and Holy Week. Discussion regarding attendance at the readings included possibly making travel arrangement for our seniors. Muffins with Mom was planned for May 3 and Outdoor service with Potluck scheduled for May 5. Sisters Sunday was scheduled for July 28 with Leah Simpson leading the service. A request was made and approved for Salem, daughter of Patrick and Erica Nail to be baptized. Homer Dearmin was sworn in as Town Manager of Rural Hall on April 7. Initial discussion of picnic at Laurel Ridge was TBD.
5. This month we discussed and planned a picnic at Laurel Ridge for May 26. A Call Process Potluck Lunch was scheduled for June 9. Doug was granted time away on Father's Day weekend. We approved having a few current fathers deliver the service and what it means to be a father and member at KMC. On June 2, four graduates were honored: Victoria Smith, Tyler Moran, Olivia Harper and Mary Cardwell. The following people were approved for membership to KMC: Pat Anderson, Frank Butler, Ben & Katie Hepler, and Lynne Anderson.
6. Again, Leah Simpson will lead the July 28 Sisters Sunday service. On August 4, Ethan Smith will conduct the service, which will be followed by a Potluck lunch. On Aug. 14, a Festival of the Moravian Church will be held including Communion. The following Sunday will be a Lovefeast and the Blessing

of the Backpacks. Sunday School will begin on Aug. 25.

7. We discussed plans for an updated church directory. 100th Anniversary activities were discussed and Doug made the request that some of our longtime members talk about their time here.

8. Goals were discussed including a church picnic Sept. 8th. A possible weekend at Laurel Ridge was discussed as well. Doug has decided that our fall Bible Study will be on the Book of James, starting on Sept. 10. The Brunswick Stew was set for October 26 and a possible chicken stew the week prior was cancelled. Our church was encouraged and planned to participate in the downtown Octoberfest, held on Sept.21. The board voted to approve the baptism of Garrett Earley, son of Brad and Megan Earley. After discussion the board approved a request to remove Debbie, Erin and Jonathan Allgood from our membership.

9. Sunday, Sept. 29 will be Worldwide Communion Sunday because of our Centennial on October 6. Brothers Sunday will be held November 3. The 100th Anniversary will be held Oct. 6 including a special Lovefeast. The choir will sing a new anthem commissioned for this service, composed by Dan Forrest, "In All Things Love."

10. Brent Seckman has agreed to present the message on Brothers Sunday. Approval was made that Doug would take the weekend off. Brent also decided to take charge of the men's fellowship breakfast monthly. On Nov. 10, Communion will be served for Festival of the Moravian Church, the actual date being Nov. 13. On Sunday evening, our Thanksgiving service will be held which will include Lovefeast. Advent begins Dec 1. Lessons and Carols are scheduled for Dec. 15 at 11:00 and 4:00. There will also be a performance at Salemtowne on Dec. 18. Christmas Lovefeasts will be held Christmas Eve: children at 11:00 am, and traditional services at 4:30 and 7:00 pm. Doug and Kathy Rights have requested and we're approved that they will light one of the Advent Candles. Doug reflected on the 100th Anniversary and his hopes and dreams for the future of KMC. As with every meeting, we closed with the Mizpah benediction.

Church facility updates included all new HVAC systems for all buildings except for the Youth House (bid has been approved). Parking lot signage has been added, turf added to section of playground area, dishwasher repaired, new door installed in nursery, upgrade to sound system in sanctuary (and hearing devices purchased to work with sound board), brick re-mortared and holes repaired on church office, and fellowship hall and preschool classrooms floors stripped and waxed. The Trustees met with members of Building and Grounds and the Capital Campaign Committee to prioritize facility HVAC needs. A new pest management contract was awarded to Ray Pest to deal with termites and other pests. Oversight was given for the mowing, landscape, cleaning, and copier contracts. Approval was given for the use of the parking lot for the farmers market during summer months.

Oversight was given for the current 2024 budget and for the investments at the Moravian Ministries Foundation of America (MMFA). Chris Spaugh, President of MMFA will be at the next Joint Board Meeting in November to give updates on investments.

Areas of concern to be discussed through the remainder of the year include Youth House renovations and meeting the 2024 budget.

Note of thanks to Jennifer Burge-Carter and Budge Gage for counting contributions each Sunday, the Finance Committee for providing oversight and development of the budget, Kim Thomas for auditing financial records and processes, Lee Christensen, treasurer, for keeping financial records and payments accurate and up-to-date and Building and Grounds Committee for keeping buildings and grounds in good shape.

## King Moravian Narrative Budget for 2025

A description of the ministry and outreach of King Moravian Church for the year 2025 and our proposed expenditures:

- A. Worship-the heart of our church experience. Much of that is regular Sunday worship but also includes special seasonal services including Christmas, Lent, Holy Week, Easter and other special services. We propose to spend **\$134,282**
- B. Pastoral Care and Care of Individuals-the personal care that we receive through our church family especially during times of sickness, crisis, bereavement, troubled relationships, aging, and loneliness. We plan to spend **\$50,432**.
- C. Christian Education and Nurturing of People in their Faith-Nurturing people in their faith helps develop a trusting relationship with God. Our church utilizes the skills of our staff to plan and facilitate a Christian Education/Nurture Program. We plan to spend for personnel, resources, and facilities in the ministry **\$100,780**
- D. Benevolent Giving and Outreach Ministry-Our church's outreach can be divided into five categories:
  - Foreign and homeland missions, crisis ministry, education, etc. that we do together with other Moravian churches
  - Local benevolences
  - Outreach to volunteer services
  - Reaching out to bring people to our community of faith. A significant portion of staff time and use of facilities are to realize this ministry.

Propose to spend for benevolent giving and outreach ministry **\$98,187**.

- E. Fellowship-Christian fellowship is eating, working, working for others, praying, worshiping, studying, laughing and sharing our lives with each other. In so doing, we share love, support, faith, hope and become a vital witnessing community. This will be **\$75,888** of our budget.

Total proposed budget: **\$459,569**
