Church Council

Sunday, November 14, 2021

Church Council for King Moravian Church convened after church service in church sanctuary. The Rev. Doug Rights called the meeting to order. He opened the meeting with prayer.

Board members then counted church members present and determined that we had a quorum in attendance.

The next item of business was to appoint a secretary to take minutes for meeting. Terri Lyda was nominated and congregation voted to accept nomination.

A report in lieu of the minutes from our last Church Council on Sunday, November 15, 2020 was then read by Rev. Doug Rights to the congregation. This meeting was during the coronavirus pandemic and we did not have a quorum so Church Council reports were reviewed and our election for Elders and Trustees was held via online survey. We had three nominees and three openings for each Board, so the congregation voted to affirm the nominees by acclamation.

The report from this year's Nominating Committee, which was composed of outgoing Elders and Trustees, was read which included elections for three Elders, three Trustees, two Youth Representatives, and three Synod Delegates. Ballots were given out to all members. Nominees for Elder were presented and introduced to congregation. The floor was then opened for any additional nominees for Elders. There were no new nominees. Doug Gordon made a motion to close nominations and Bill Pulliam seconded. Voting was completed and ballots were taken up and counted by Scott Cardwell and Holly Mathis, outgoing board members, outside of sanctuary. Nominees for Trustees were then introduced. The floor was opened for any additional nominations for Trustee. There were no new nominations. Doug Gordon made a motion to close nominations. Ken Lyda seconded and nominations were closed. Nominees were then elected by acclamation of all members present. The nominee for Youth Representative was announced. The floor was opened for new nominations. Paula Hall nominated Gordon Grabs for the second Youth Representative position. Mark Johnson made a motion to accept new nomination and close the floor for nominations. Homer Dearmin seconded the motion. The two nominees were then elected by acclamation of all members present. The nominees for Synod Delegates were then presented and introduced. The floor was opened for additional nominees. There were none. Ken Sevier made a motion to close nominations and Doug Gordon seconded. All three were then voted in by acclamation of all members present. Since we were still waiting on results from Elders election, Rev. Doug Rights proceeded to the next item on the agenda, which were Board and Staff Reports.

The congregation was given time to review reports which were also available for reviewing online this past week. Rev. Doug Rights asked if there were any questions, comments, or corrections regarding any of the reports. Lynne Doby made one clarification to Christian Education Report in noting that the Good News Sunday school class met by Zoom during the Covid Pandemic and not in person. This update was acknowledged. There were no other comments concerning Board and staff Reports.

Dane Heath, Chair of the Trustees spoke to the congregation. On behalf of the Trustees, he thanked the congregation for helping the church stay on track financially this past year. He reported that our church's Provincial Share monthly payments will be going up this coming year to \$4,800.00. It went

down last year and this year goes back up to place us essentially back where we were 2 years ago in payments. He reviewed the church's Narrative Budget for 2022. If anyone wants more detailed information on budget, please contact a Finance Committee member or the church office. Dane thanked the Finance Committee for all their hard work in completing the budget.

Dane Heath then gave a report on the upcoming Capital Campaign. The committee has set a goal to raise \$500,000.00 by October 2022, which is our church's 100th anniversary. We have many pressing needs that need our attention. Included are a need for a new HVAC system and a new roof. It will be a very big undertaking and we all need to be in prayer for this project and how each of us can be on board to help meet our goal. If you have any questions, ideas, or want to help in any way, please let us know.

Rev. Doug Rights then asked the congregation to take a moment to remember our Saints, those members who have passed away since our last church council.

We then sang "Jesus Makes My Heart Rejoice".

The results from the Elders election were then announced. Mark Johnson, Barbara Sudol, and Terri Lyda were elected as Elders.

Rev. Doug Rights announced that services for Daryl Neve would be held in the sanctuary next Sunday.

Upon completion of business, Jim Hall made a motion to close the meeting. Budge Gage seconded the motion and the congregation passed the motion to adjourn the meeting.

PASTOR'S REPORT FOR 2022 CHURCH COUNCIL

It continues to be a great pleasure and privilege to be your pastor at King Moravian. It is hard for me to believe that I have had the opportunity to serve in this capacity for what is now five years. Even though this report is about this past year, I cannot help but take a moment to reflect on the years I have been at King Moravian. For me, I look back on my first few years as a time of growth and progress for our church family. Upon entering a new decade in 2020, I felt a lot of excitement and expectation for our church family as he had a lot of momentum going for us. Little did we know that in March of 2020 much of the excitement and expectation came to a halt with COVID. For the next two years, we faced many challenges as a church family in our ways of doing ministry, our connections, and our faithfulness for which I am very thankful for the many who helped keep our church family going through some tough and unpredictable times.

For this past year, I felt what we put on hold for the most part in the previous two years has now begun to take place. What I have appreciated is how we have taken some lessons from what we experienced through COVID, and we are using these lessons to enhance our ministry. One event which was wonderful to resume was our Lessons and Carols this past December. We had limited seating due to COVID concerns, yet we made the extra effort to hire technicians to livestream one of the Lessons and Carols services which showed us what could be done with some good livestream equipment. Besides the hundreds of people who attended and enjoyed the services, our recording of the service received over 1,000 views! This experience further enhanced our desire for better livestreaming equipment. This desire was verbalized in one of the goals set by our Joint Board this year. This desire was realized in the efforts of our Audio Visual Task Force which met, studied, purchased, oversaw the installation, and is now implementing our new livestream equipment which has been a definite upgrade for our online services. For this equipment, our church is very appreciative to Roger Cooke. This past year we had several of our faithful members go on to be with the Lord. Roger was one of them, and our church appreciates Roger's generous gift to King Moravian upon his passing which enabled us to purchase the equipment.

One thing I have appreciated this year is how our Joint Boards and our church family has worked on our church goals which were set in January by our Board of Elders and Board of Trustees. Upgrading our livestreaming has been one of these goals. Others have included keeping our church family connected which is a goal our Elders have been working on through a survey and offering fellowship events. Goals we continue to work on are being aware of our resources, other streams of funding, addressing who we are, having more of our youth involved in worship, and trying to get our community more involved in our Mission Blitz.

Our largest goal on our goal list is one that has been there for the past few years. Our boards and others realize our building needs and the great cost for these needs. Our boards have talked about a capital campaign for a few years, and this year we have taken the step to have it. I appreciate the work of our Capital Campaign Steering Committee for laying a great foundation for our campaign. I am thankful for the wonderful Campaign Dinner we had at the beginning of October to get our campaign started. I am grateful for our individuals and families who have already made their two-year pledge or their one time gift for this campaign. I look forward to seeing the needed funds raised and how they will not only be used to meet the building needs of our church, but also how a portion of what we receive will be used for our community.

As I look back on this year, I have several highlights. I enjoyed teaching and spending time with our Confirmation Class. We had a great group of eight of our young people and seven of them were confirmed. For my previous years, I have served as a leader for our Junior Youth Fellowship which I have thoroughly enjoyed. This fall I decided to work with our Senior Highs and Middle Highs. It has been wonderful to see this combined group get off to a good start with our Opening Cookout, how

they enjoyed a special and fun-filled weekend retreat at Laurel Ridge, and how they have been coming and growing in numbers and in spirit to our meetings and events. It has been great seeing us getting back to having Wednesday Night Dinners. It's wonderful that we have begun having a monthly Men's Breakfast, and special thanks to Mike Handy for his leadership with this program. It was great being part of another wonderful Mission Blitz as we reached out to those in need in our community.

I continue to be very appreciative and grateful for the wonderful support I receive from so many in our church family. I want to thank our church boards for their love for the Lord, their love for our church family, and their desire to make King Moravian the best church it can be. I want to thank the many of you in our church family and friends of our church family who use your gifts and abilities in the many ministries of our church. I am very grateful for our wonderful staff who include our Director of Christian Education, Rachael Butts, our Office Administrator, Leigha Davis, our Church Treasurer, Lee Christianson, our Organist, Jennifer Dunn, our Preschool Director, Tina Pratt, and our Church Manager, Brent Seckman. I, along with our church family, are also very grateful for our Director of Music, Drake Flynt, and this past year Drake celebrated his 40th year of serving in this capacity. I am blessed to be part of a very talented staff that works well together and is there for each other.

This past year there have been some challenges for us. Even though it seems we continue to come more and more out of COVID, we are not yet where we were before COVID in our attendance and giving. Yet I continue to be grateful for all who come to our services, who attend our church's programs and events, who share in the ministry of our church family, who are generous in their giving, and who strive to make King Moravian a great church for God.

As we move forward from this Church Council, it continues to be my goal and my desire to be the best pastor I can be for our church family. Please know I am here for you, and I hope I can do all I can for you. As we continue together, I hope you will keep my family and me in your prayers. Please know you are in mine. And please keep our church family in your prayers. May we be the church God wants us to be, and may we make a difference for the Lord in our lives, in our community, and in the world!

Director of Christian Education End of Year Report

Preschool

I have continued to be part of the preschool committee and have attended all preschool meetings in support of Tina and the preschool teachers. I have assisted with preschool graduation, Lovefeast, and other events hosted by the preschool.

Sunday school

The junior Sunday school class is taught by Terri Lyda and Nancy Witt, they use Deep Blue curriculum. The middle and sr.high Sunday school is taught by Meredith Smith and Holly Mathis assists her, they use Canvas curriculum. There is a new Sunday school class that meets in the women's parlor, they use the book Uncommon Prayer for a group discussion. The Good News class is led by Sue Gentry and Lynne Doby, they use the Present Word curriculum.

Children's Ministry

Vacation Bible school was August 10th-12th. We used a Cokesbury VBS package, Food Truck Party- On A Roll With God. During those days we studied how God nourishes and provides our body, mind, and soul. Each night there was an opening session, bible story, snack, music, recreation, craft, and closing session. There were over forty children registered.

Conformation class was from October 24th-April 10th. I assisted Doug who taught this class on Sunday mornings at 10am. We had six children graduate on Palm Sunday.

Safe Sanctuary guidelines are still in place. We have twenty four people that are Safe Sanctuary certified. There will be a renewal opportunity in the Spring.

Youth fellowship

According to my records we have:

12 Middle High youth

11 Junior youth

Middle and sr.high leaders are: Jennifer Shore, Holly Mathis, Bill Pullium, Darrel Goins, Myra Goins, Rachael Butts, Doug Rights, Jay Duncan, and Meredith Smith. We combined both groups.

Junior youth group leaders are: Rachael Butts, Kent Wall, Jessica Wall, Emily Duncan, Erica Nail, and Patrick Nail. They meet twice a month.

Congregational Events

Served on the Share the Blessing committee and volunteered for Mission Blitz, October 7th-9th. We were able to complete three house projects as well as church maintenance projects. I helped coordinate food deliveries, job sites, and organized volunteers.

An audio visual team was created in January of 2022. For several months the team researched the proper equipment for our church needs and met with professionals from other churches and organizations. We now have two cameras and upgraded software to livestream Sunday mornings.

The task force committee met a few times in the beginning of the year to continue the discussion of COVID-19 safety protocols. At this point in time the committee feels that King Moravian can be fully open with limited precautions.

Provincial

Since January 2021 I have served on the planning committee for the Moravian Ministries Association. I am now one of the lead coordinators. With the team we coordinate a monthly meeting virtually or in person. I will continue to be a coordinator for the MMA for another year.

June 1st-4th I attend Synod at Winston Salem State University. During those days at Synod I served as a facilitator for Children, Youth, and Family Faith Formation. As a facilitator, I attended all pre Synod meetings and met with my committee twice before Synod began.

I opened my file to begin certification for Christian Education in August of 2021. Here is the breakdown of what I have done to seek completion of certification.

- In February I attended the APCE (Association of Partners in Church Education). This conference was to go to credit hours for continuing education.
- Completed all required modules online through Opening Doors of Discipleship.
- Completed a book study with my assigned mentor.
- Met monthly with my assigned mentor.
- Completed a Moravian Polity course taught by Reddick Webber at Laurel Ridge.

I am on the last steps of certification. I am currently working on three case scenarios that will be discussed with the Board of Commission. After I have met with the Commission, they will discuss approval of certification.

Elders Report

This has been a challenging year coming off of COVID and trying to be appropriate with our programming so that people were excited and willing to come. The Elders did a lot of praying and soul searching to figure this out.

January started out with our Board retreat. We set Church goals and elected our Vice Chair -Desty McEwan and Secretary Terri Lyda.
